- CCC 2010 —Since the initiative belongs to God in the order of grace, no one can merit the initial grace of forgiveness and justification, at the beginning of conversion. Moved by the Holy Spirit and by charity, we can then merit for ourselves and for others the graces needed for our sanctification, for the increase of grace and charity, and for the attainment of eternal life
- CCC 2027 No one can merit the initial grace which is at the origin of conversion.
 Moved by the Holy Spirit, we can merit for ourselves and for others all the graces needed to attain eternal life, as well as necessary temporal goods.
- **CCC 2019** Justification includes the remission of sins, sanctification, and the renewal of the inner man.
- CCC 1861 Mortal sin is a radical possibility of human freedom, as is love itself. It
 results in the loss of charity and the privation of sanctifying grace, that is, of the state of
 grace. If it is not redeemed by repentance and God's forgiveness, it causes exclusion
